Our Work

For more than 60 years, the U.S. Capitol Historical Society has proudly worked to preserve and share the history of the Capitol, the Congress, and the people who work therein. As a nonpartisan, educational, 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, the Society was chartered by Congress in 1978 in part "to foster and increase an informed patriotism." In service of this mission, the Society conducts historical tours of the Capitol Building, hosts virtual and in-person public history programming on various aspects of Capitol history, coordinates an open-access civic education hub, manages a renowned civic education field trip program for DC schools, and commissions works of fine art for the Capitol collections.

Thanks to our donors' generous support in 2024, we provided impactful programs that inspired civic engagement and connected people with the history of American democracy.

We remain committed to empowering the next generation to protect and strengthen our democratic institutions, and striving "to encourage in the most comprehensive and enlightened manner an understanding by the American people of the founding, growth, and significance of the Capitol... as the tangible symbol of their representative form of government."



Civic Education

Expanding Access

- During the 2023–24 school year, the Society's <u>We the People Constitution Tours™</u> served 1,054 students from 12 Title I schools in the District of Columbia, providing transportation, lunches, and tour guides, and enabling hands-on learning experiences at the heart of our democracy.
- The <u>2024 Three Branches Teacher Institute</u> virtually served 261 teachers from 44 states, Washington, DC, and Puerto Rico, through them reaching approximately 286,000 students. Hosted with the White House Historical Association and the Supreme Court Historical Society, this program provided educators with high-quality virtual resources from the <u>Capitol Civics Hub</u> to apply in their classrooms. 100% of participants said they would recommend it to their colleagues.
- In November 2024, during the 104th National Council for Social Studies
 Conference in Boston, Society staff promoted the <u>Capitol Civics Hub</u> by
 presenting lesson plans, primary sources, and educational initiatives to
 educators across the country.

Civic Workshops

- In February 2024, the Society partnered with the Rutherford B. Hayes
 Presidential Library & Museums in Fremont, OH, to host a workshop for
 24 teachers from 12 states. The program explored the 1876 presidential
 election and Congress's role in the Electoral College.
- In September 2024, the Society collaborated with the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum in Springfield, IL, for a workshop that brought together 23 educators from 13 states and the Northern Mariana Islands. Participants explored Senate rules, the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the 1908 Springfield race riots.


Inspiring Programs

In February 2024, the Society presented its <u>2023 Freedom Award</u> to 36th Clerk of the House Cheryl L. Johnson for her exceptional leadership and pivotal role in preserving – and commitment to upholding – the American democratic process. Former Speakers of the House Nancy Pelosi and Kevin McCarthy spoke of their appreciation of and admiration for Clerk Johnson as part of the tribute.

In May 2024, the Society hosted the <u>2024 Native American Suffrage Symposium</u>, bringing together leading figures in Native American history, law, and advocacy to highlight critical issues of citizenship, sovereignty, suffrage, and activism.

In December 2024, the Society recognized Representatives Derek Kilmer and William Timmons with the <u>2024 Freedom Award</u> for their bipartisan leadership of the House Select Committee on Modernization and successful efforts to implement more than 200 good-government reforms. Speaker of the House Mike Johnson participated in the ceremony honoring their achievements.
